STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT to Amend Section Four of Chapter Seventy-one of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred Nine Relating to the Improvement of Free High Schools.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section four of chapter seventy-one of the public laws of 2 nineteen hundred nine is hereby amended by striking out

- 3 the word "annually" in the second line thereof and inserting
- 4 after the word "thousand" in the fourth line thereof the
- 5 words 'two hundred,' so that said section when amended
- 6 shall read as follows:

'Sect. 4. All schools of secondary grade receiving state 8 aid shall be inspected under the direction of the state super9 intendent of public schools, and for this purpose he shall be authorized to expend not to exceed two thousand two hun11 dred dollars annually, which sum shall be paid from the 12 state appropriation for the support of high schools; and he 13 shall determine what schools are included in the classifica14 tion of section one of this act, what schools maintain the 15 courses of study, what schools are entitled to state aid and 16 what schools maintain approved courses for the reception 17 of tuition scholars.'
