STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT to amend paragraph seven of section one hundred of
chapter fifteen of the Revised Statutes relating to the course
of study in common schools.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Paragraph seven of section one hundred of chapter fifteen
2 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding after
3 the word "studies" in the third line thereof the following:
4 'and the course of study prescribed by the state superin-
5 tendent of schools shall be followed in all public schools,
6 provided, however, that upon the approval by the state
7 superintendent of any course arranged by the superintend-
8 ing school committee of any town said course shall be the

9 authorized course for said town,' so that said paragraph
10 when amended shall read as follows:

'Section 100, paragraph VII. To prescribe the studies to
12 be taught in the common schools, reserving to town com-
13 mittees the right to prescribe additional studies and the
14 course of study prescribed by the state superintendent of
15 schools shall be followed in all public schools, provided,
16 however, that upon the approval by the state superintendent
17 of any course arranged by the superintending school com-
18 mittee of any town said course shall be the authorized course
19 for said town.'
