STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT to repeal Chapter 215 of the Private and Special Laws of 1887 and amendatory of Chapter 281 of the Private and Special Laws of 1901, relating to Eastern Maine Institute.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Chapter two hundred eighty-one of the private and special
laws of 1901, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Section 1. Pitt H. Jones, Ralph Scribner, Lysander W.

- 4 Trask, James A. Reed, Nye C. Whiting, Philo Bearce,
- 5 George I. Hebb, Ira Ralph Averill and the superintending
- 6 school committee of the town of Springfield and their asso-
- 7 ciates and successors are hereby constituted a corporation
- 8 by the name of the Trustees of Eastern Maine Institute and

9 by that name may sue and be sued, have a common seal, 10 make such by-laws not repugnant to the laws of the state 11 of Maine as they may deem expedient for the management 12 of their affairs, take and hold real and personal estate to 13 the amount not exceeding one hundred and fifty thousand 14 dollars, the income thereof to be used to promote education.

Sect. 2. The board of trustees shall be eleven and of this 17 number the superintending school committee of the town of 18 Springfield, and each of them, during their term of office, 19 shall always be members. The remaining eight and their 20 successors shall be those named in section 1 of this act.

Sect. 3. The board of trustees may by a majority ballot, 22 fill all vacancies that may arise by reason of vacancies in 23 the board, excepting vacancies in the board of superintend-24 ing school committee; the board shall organize by the choice 25 of a president, treasurer and secretary and all other neces-26 sary officers, by a majority ballot. They shall choose all 27 necessary teachers and shall have charge of the manage-28 ment and educational work of this institution—and they are 29 hereby invested with all the powers, privileges, rights and 30 immunities incident to similar corporations and institutions, 31 and they may appont suitable committees from the members 32 of the board who shall have general care and supervision of 33 the institution and its work.

Sect. 4. A majority of the board of trustees shall consti-35 tute a quorum at any meeting of the board for the election 36 of officers and for transacting business.

Sect. 5. The treasurer shall give an indemnity bond in 38 such sum as the trustees may require, to be put into the 39 keeping of the town treasurer of said town of Springfield, 40 for the faithful performance of his duties and for the proper 41 care and custody of all moneys held by him, from time to 42 time.

Sect. 6. The board of trustees shall hold their annual 44 meetings at such place and time as is provided in the by-45 laws. Special meetings of the board may be held from 46 time to time on the call of the president, and may be called 47 by either the president or the secretary of the board, by 48 giving three days' notice thereof in writing to each member 49 of the trustees.

Sect. 7. Whatever sum of money the inhabitants of the 51 town of Springfield shall raise to expend for the mainte-52 nance of a free high school as provided by law, shall be 53 appropriated and expended by said board of trustees for 54 the support and maintenance of said Eastern Maine Insti-55 tute. Said board of trustees may fix the amount of tuition 56 to be charged scholars attending said school residing beyond 57 the limits of said town of Springfield and said Eastern 58 Maine Institute shall be entitled to the same state aid, on 59 account of the money so raised by said town of Springfield 60 and also on account of the money received for tuition and

61 expended, that it would be entitled to if the same were ex-62 pended for a free high school.

Sect. 8. The treasurer of said Eastern Maine Institute 64 shall make and file a statement of the moneys received and 65 expended during each year—one to be recorded in the town 66 clerk's office and another to be given to the treasurer of 67 said town of Springfield.

Sect. 9. All books and records of said Eastern Maine 69 Institute are to be open to the inspection of any of the citi70 zens of said town of Springfield.'
