## STATE OF MAINE

## IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT additional to chapter thirty-two of the Revised Statutes, as amended by chapter two hundred and six of the Public Laws of nineteen hundred and thirteen, relating to fishing in Mill brook and in Metalluc brook, tributaries to Upper Richardson Lake, and at the mouth of said Metalluc brook, in the county of Oxford.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows.

No person shall fish for, take, catch or kill any kind of fish 2 at any time in Mill brook or in Metalluc brook, tributaries 3 to Upper Richardson Lake, in the County of Oxford.

No person shall fish for, take, catch, or kill any kind of 5 fish at any time from the mouth of said Metalluc brook out

6 as far as the island except in the ordinary manner of cast-7 ing with artificial flies, or fly fishing.

No person shall have in possession at any time any kind of 9 fish taken in violation of any provision of this act.

Whoever violates any provision of this act shall pay a fine of not less than ten dollars nor more than thirty dollars and costs for each offense; and in addition thereto one dollar for act fish taken, caught, killed or had in possession in violation of any provision of this act.
