#### STATE OF MAINE

## IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT additional to chapter 32 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by chapter 206 of the public laws of 1913, relating to fishing in Rum pond, in Piscataquis county.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

No person shall fish for, take, catch or kill any kind of fish 2 at any time in Rum pond, situated in the town of Greenville 3 and in Township Number eight, Range Ten, N. W. P., in 4 Piscataquis county, except from the fifteenth day of July of 5 each year until September thirtieth following, both days in-6 clusive, during which open season it shall be lawful to fish 7 in said pond in accordance with the general law of the 8 State.

No person shall have in possession at any time any kind of 10 fish taken in violation of any provision of this act.

Whoever violates any provision of this act shall pay a fine 12 of not less than ten dollars nor more than thirty dollars and 13 costs for each offense and in addition thereto one dollar for 14 each fish taken, caught, killed or had in possession in violation of any provision of this act.
