STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT relating to the salaries of Subordinate Officers of
the House of Representatives.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. The clerk of the House of Representatives shall
2 perform the usual duties of his office during the session of
3 the legislature and index and supervise the publication of
4 the House Journal. He shall also perform the services re-
5 quired of him by section twenty-eight and thirty-one of
6 chapter two of the revised statutes.

He shall receive a salary of fourteen hundred dollars in
8 full for all official services by him performed during the
9 term for which he is chosen, as follows: Eleven hundred
10 dollars at the close of the session of the legislature, and

11 three hundred dollars when the Journal of the House is
12 completed.

Sect. 2. The assistant clerk of the House shall receive a
2 salary of six hundred dollars. His work shall be per-
3 formed under the direction of the clerk.

Sect. 3. The messenger shall receive a salary of four
2 hundred dollars.

Sect. 4. The assistant messenger, document clerk, first
2 folder, second folder, postmaster, mail carrier and door-
3 keeper shall each receive a salary of three hundred dollars.

Sect. 5. The pages shall each receive a salary of one
2 hundred and fifty dollars.

Sect. 6. The official reporter of the House shall receive
2 a salary of one thousand dollars.

Sect. 7. All of the above mentioned officers shall work un-
2 der the direction of the Speaker of the House.

The above salaries shall be in full for all official services
4 by them performed during the term for which they are
5 chosen and no other or further compensation shall be al-
6 lowed them, except in case of an adjourned or special ses-
7 sion of the legislature.
