STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE Providing for Fencing around the New Water Supply at the Maine School for Feeble-Minded.

Resolved, That there be and hereby is appropriated the 2 sum of five hundred dollars, for the year nineteen hun-3 dred and fifteen, for the use of the Maine School for Feeble-4 Minded, for fencing around the new water supply, and 5 that any of this appropriation remaining unexpended at the 6 end of said year may be available for the year nineteen 7 hundred and sixteen; said sum to be expended under the 8 direction of the hospital trustees.



STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The dam and the pumping station for the new water supply from the Collyer Brook are located in a pasture where a herd of cattle is kept during the summer months. In order to protect the water from pollution by the cattle, it will be necessary to fence around the dam and the pumping station, and the sides of the stream for several thousand feet above the dam.
