## STATE OF MAINE

## IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINF HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT to amend Section 5 of Chapter 209, Public Laws of 1913, entitled an act to regulate the business of Dealing in Securities.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
Section 1. Section 5 of Chapter 209 of the Public Laws of
2 1913, is hereby amended by adding after the word "registra-3 tion" in the last line of said section, the following:

'Provided, however, that such application for renewal of 5 registrations for the year 1915 shall be made on or before 6 the first of May, 1915, but thereafter shall be made on 7 or before the first day of March in each year, and if not so 8 made, applications thereafter received shall be treated as, 9 and be subject to the same fees provided for, original reg-10 istrations,' so that said section as amended shall read as 11 follows:

'Sect. 5. All registrations shall expire at the close of the 13 calendar year, but new registrations for the succeeding year 14 shall be issued as of course, without the filing of further 15 statements of furnishing any further information, unless 16 specifically requested by the commissioner, upon written ap-17 plication of the dealer and payment of a registration fee of 18 five dollars for each registration. Provided, however, that 19 such application for renewal of registrations for the year 20 1915 shall be made on or before the first day of May, 1915, 21 but thereafter shall be made on or before the first day of 22 March in each year, and if not so made, applications there-23 after received shall be treated as, and be subject to the 24 same fees provided for, original registrations.'

Sect. 2. In order to facilitate the registration of dealers, 2 this act shall take effect immediately upon its passage.
