STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE in favor of the Town of Pittsfield.

Resolved, That the sum of twelve dollars and three cents
2 be and is hereby appropriated to reimburse the town of
3 Pittsfield for supplies furnished State paupers.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

This resolve covers small balances due on pauper supplies furnished S. G. Burton and Geo. W. Gray in 1906, 1907 and 1908. These parties were acknowledged state paupers, and the bills rendered by the town of Pittsfield for their support have been paid with the exception of the amount called for herein. Some of these bills were not presented until after the appropriations were exhausted, and there is one small bill which seems to have remained unpaid through an error. The money was paid out in good faith by the town of Pittsfield, and the Overseers of the Poor feel that in fairness their town should be reimbursed by the State.
