AN ACT to Disorganize Muscle Ridge Plantation, in the  
County of Knox.

---

---

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

Section 1. Muscle Ridge Plantation, in the County of  
2 Knox, the organization of which was validated and legalized  
3 by the provisions of Chapter thirteen of the private and spe-  
4 cial laws of nineteen hundred and five, is hereby disorgan-  
5 ized.

Sect. 2. All funds unexpended for school purposes at the  
2 time when this act is effective out of amounts raised by  
3 said plantation for school purposes or out of amounts paid  
4 by the State for school purposes, shall be paid by the treas-

5 urer of said plantation or such other person in whose cus-  
6 tody such funds may be, to the treasurer of state. Such  
7 amounts, so received, shall constitute a fund for school pur-  
8 poses of which the income only shall be expended and ap-  
9 plied for the schooling of children resident within the limits  
10 of the present plantation.

Sect. 3. This act shall take effect December thirty-first,  
2 nineteen hundred and sixteen, excepting that after July fif-  
3 teenth, nineteen hundred and fifteen, the state superintend-  
4 ent of public schools may provide school privileges for any  
5 persons of school age residing in said plantation and may  
6 expend any and all school funds which would be affected  
7 by the passage of this act in the same manner and with the  
8 same effect as though this act had taken effect.
