STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT Relating to the Qualification and Duties of the In-
spectors of Steamboats.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section five, of chapter fifty-four of the revised statutes,
2 is hereby amended by striking out after the word "qualifi-
3 cations," in the second line thereof the words, "one of whom
4 shall have a practical knowledge of ship building, and the
5 other of the construction and use of boilers, engines and
6 their appurtenances;" and by inserting in place thereof the
7 words, 'each of whom shall have a practical knowledge of
8 ship building and of the construction and use of boilers, en-
9 gines and their appurtenances;' also by adding at the end

10 of said section the following words, 'The inspectors so ap-
11 pointed shall divide the State into two districts and upon
12 each in his district shall hereafter devolve the duties hereto-
13 fore required of the inspector of hulls and the inspector of
14 boilers and engines;' so that said section as amended shall
15 read as follows:

'Sect. 5. The governor, with the advice and consent of the
17 council, shall appoint two inspectors of steamboats of suit-
18 able qualifications, each of whom shall have a practical
19 knowledeg of ship building and of the construction of boil-
20 ers, engines and their appurtenances; they shall continue in
21 office for five years, unless sooner removed for good cause,
22 and may be re-appointed at the expiration of their term.
23 The inspectors so appointed shall divide the State into two
24 districts and upon each in his district shall hereafter de-
25 volve the duties heretofore required of the inspector of
26 hulls and the inspector of boilers and engines.'
