STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE in favor of Luella Darling for a State Pensions.

*Resolved, That the sum of twelve dollars (\$12.00) per
2 month be paid to Luella Darling, widow of Hiram Darling
3 of Oxbow, Maine, for the years 1915 and 1916.*

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Luella Darling lives in Oxbow, Maine. She is the widow of Hiram Darling, who was a private in the 14th Maine Regiment, and who during his life received a pension of twelve dollars (\$12.00) per month from the United States. He died August 16, 1894.

He was married to Luella Darling November 11, 1883, and she has been unable to obtain any pension from the United States. She has no property of any kind, has been working for her board for the last few years, but her health is so poor she must have assistance from the public or she will be a charge upon her town. She is sixty-seven years of age, and unable to contribute anything towards her own support, and has no relatives that are liable for her care and maintenance.
