STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE in favor of the town of Harmony.

*Resolved, That the sum of sixty-two dollars and fifty-three
2 cents be and is hereby appropriated to reimburse the town
3 of Harmony for expenses incurred in the support of Archie
4 R. Mullen and family, state paupers.*

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Archie R. Mullen and family have had pauper supplies from the town of Harmony and other towns almost every year for the past eight years or more, but not to any large amount. The Legislature of 1909 passed a resolve for \$46.00 in favor of the town of Harmony for supplies furnished this family in 1907 and 1908.

It was then shown to the satisfaction of the Legislature that they had no settlement in the State, but there is no affidavit on file to justify the payment of the bills from the general appropriation for support of paupers. Mullen's present whereabouts are unknown. He was divorced from his first wife in 1913 and has since married again.

The bills for which this appropriation is asked are for supplies furnished since the early part of 1912. Mullen's former wife and her youngest child are now living in the town of Har-
