STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT additional to chapter thirty-two of the Revised Statutes, as amended by chapter two hundred and six of the Public Laws of nineteen hundred and thirteen, relating to fishing in Berry pond and its tributaries, in the town of Winthrop and in the town of Wayne, in the County of Kennebec.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

No person shall fish for, take, catch or kill any kind of fish 2 at any time on or through the ice in Berry pond, situated in 3 the town of Winthrop and in the town of Wayne, in the 4 county of Kennebec; nor shall any person fish for, take. 5 catch or kill any kind of fish at any time in any of the tribu-6 taries to said pond; nor shall any person have in possession

7 at any time any kind of fish taken in any of said tributaries 8 or through the ice in said pond.

Whoever violates any provision of this act shall pay a fine 10 of not less than ten dollars nor more than thirty dollars and 11 costs of prosecution for each offense; and in addition there12 to one dollar for each fish taken, caught, killed or had in 13 possession in violation of any provision of this act.
