STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT additional to Chapter thirty-two of the Revised Statutes, as amended by Chapter two hundred and six of the Public Laws of nineteen hundred and thirteen, relating to the taking of fish in certain waters in Washington and Aroostook counties.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

In addition to the general law it shall be unlawful to fish
2 for, take, catch or kill any kind of fish at any time except
3 for consumption in one's home, in the waters of Baskehegan
4 lake and stream, Hot Brook lake and stream, or in any of
5 the tributaries to said waters; or in Schoodic Grand lake,
6 North lake, Brackett lake or in any of the tributaries to said

7 lakes, or in Lambert lake, or in the waters between Schoo-
8 dic Grand lake and Chepenticook lake, which waters are sit-
9 uated in the county of Washington and in the county of
10 Aroostook; nor shall any fish taken in any of the above
11 named waters be transported except in the possession of the
12 person taking the same, accompanied by him, open to view
13 and plainly labeled with his name and residence; nor shall
14 any person take, catch and kill in any one day more than
15 fifteen pickerel in all in Baskehegan lake or in Baskehegan
16 stream or in any of the tributaries to said stream, nor shall
17 any person have in possession in any one day more than
18 fifteen pickerel in all taken in any of said waters.

Whoever violates any provision of this act shall pay a fine
20 of not less than ten dollars nor more than thirty dollars and
21 costs for each offense; and in addition thereto one dollar
22 for each fish taken, caught, killed, transported or had in
23 possession in violation of any provision of this act.
