STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT to regulate the taking of frogs from Big Fish lake, Portage lake, Square lake, Eagle lake, Long lake, Soldier pond and in the tributaries to said pond and lakes, in Aroostook county.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

No person shall take any frogs from Big Fish lake, Portage lake, Square lake, Eagle lake, Long lake, Soldier pond, or in any of the tributaries to said pond or lakes, in the county of Aroostook, except for domestic use in the family of the person taking the same.

Whoever violates the provisions of this act shall pay a fine
7 of not less than ten dollars nor more than thirty dollars and
8 costs for each offense; and in addition thereto one dollar
9 for each frog taken, caught, killed or had in possession in
10 violation of this act.
