STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT additional to chapter thirty-two of the Revised Statutes as amended by chapter two hundred and six of the Public Laws of nineteen hundred and thirteen, relating to fishing in Shagg. Abbott and Little Concord ponds and their tributaries, in Oxford County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

No person shall fish for, take, catch or kill any kind of fish 2 at any time in any of the tributaries to Shagg pond, in 3 Woodstock, except that suckers may be taken in said tributaries in accordance with the general law of the State, nor 5 shall any person take, catch and kill in any one day more

6 than two trout and landlocked salmon in all in said Shagg

7 pond, Little Concord pond in Woodstock, and Abbott pond 8 in Sumner, all in the county of Oxford.

No person shall have in possession any kind of fish taken to in violation of any provision of this act.

Whoever violates any provision of this act shall pay a fine 12 of not less than ten dollars nor more than thirty dollars and 13 costs for each offense; and in addition thereto one dollar 14 for each fish taken, caught, killed or had in possession in 15 violation of any provision of this act.
