STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT Amending Chapter 44, Public Laws of 1907, relating to the Maine School for Feeble-Minded.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows: Chapter 44 of the Public Laws of 1907 and amended there-2 of, is hereby amended.

After the word "minded" in Section I in the second line, 4 by striking out the following words: "Six years of age and 5 upwards, which shall be known as the Maine School for 6 Feeble-Minded," and insert in place thereof the following: 7 'Males between the ages of six years and forty years and 8 Females between the ages of six years and forty-five years, 9 except that state paupers may be admitted after the before

10 stated ages, which shall be known as the Maine School for 11 Feeble-Minded,' so that said section shall read as follows:

'Section I. The state shall establish and maintain a school 13 for the care and education of the idiotic and feeble-minded, 14 males between the ages of six years and forty years and 15 females between the ages of six years and forty-five years 16 except that feeble-minded state paupers may be admitted 17 after the before stated ages, which shall be known as the 18 Maine School for Feeble-Minded.'
