STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE in favor of the City of Biddeford.

Resolved, That the sum of nine hundred and thirty-six dol-
2 lars, and that sum is hereby appropriated, be paid by the
3 treasurer of the state to the city of Biddeford out of moneys
4 of the state, not otherwise appropriated, for money expend-
5 ed by the said city of Biddeford, for the care and support
6 of Cyrille Nolette, a state pauper, and said sum shall be
7 paid only on vouchers produced by said city of Biddeford
8 and approved by the governor and council.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Cyrille Nolette was a state pauper and has been cared for and supported by the city of Biddeford, and in his behalf, as aforesaid, large sums of money have been paid out and expended, as appears by vouchers, herewith to be produced, of the following parties:

Cyrille Nolette was born at St. Ferdinand D'Halifax, Dec. 25th, 1860, lived there until 1875, then went to St. Julian, lived there until March, 1880, then went to Ashuelot, N. H., lived there until January 1st, 1884, then went to St. Julian, P. Q., lived there until September 15th, 1895, then went to Hinsdale, N. H., lived there until April, 1900, then went to St. Julian, P. Q., and lived there until April 17th, 1903, then came to Biddeford and has lived there ever since.

He applied for admission to the city farm in the city of Biddeford on April 4th, 1904, and was admitted on that date on account of sickness, and has been an inmate of said city farm and supported by said city of Biddeford ever since. He was married at Ashuelot, N. H., April 2nd, 1881, to Napoleone Labrecque. There have been born to him and his wife twelve children, now living, as follows:

Napoleon, born at Ashuelot, Jan. 15, 1882; George, born at Ashuelot, N. H., March 15th, 1883; Alphonso, born at St. Julian, January 16th; Eugene, born at St. Julian, July 13th, 1891; Alfred born at St. Julian, May 13th, 1892; Alphonsine, born at St. Julian, November 20th, 1893; Georgiana, born at St. Julian, November 24th, 1895; Albert, born at Hinsdale, May 10th, 1896; Marie, born at Hinsdale, April 28th, 1899; Cyril, born at St. Julian, July 5th, 1900; Delphise, born at St. Julian, October 16th, 1902; Rosanna, born at Biddeford, December 18th, 1903.

His father's name was Francois Nolette, born in Canada in 1834, and died there in 1899.

His mother's name was Mina Marcoux, born in Canada in 1836, and died in Canada in 1906.

His wife's father's name was Magloire Labrecque, born in Canada, and died there in 1895. His wife's mother's name was Marie Valliere. She was born in Canada in 1815, and died there in 1903.

Neither his parents, nor those of his wife, were ever residents of the United States.

The city of Biddeford has not been reimbursed in whole or in part for the care and support of the said Cyrille Nolette, given and rendered, as appears by the statement of assistance above.

The foregoing statement is verified by the oath of the said Cyrille Nolette, as appears by affidavit on file in the auditor's office, this state, and sworn to by the said Nolette, on the 29th day of December, 1914.
