STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT to amend Section 35 of Chapter 114 of the Revised
Statutes, relating to a relief of poor debtors.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section thirty-five, chapter one hundred fourteen of the
2 revised statutes, is hereby amended by inserting therein
3 after the word "attend" in the second line thereof the fol-
4 lowing: 'any justice of the peace may continue the case not
5 exceeding twice or,' so that said section as amended shall
6 read as follows:

'Sect. 35. In case the magistrate who issued the summons
8 is unable to attend any justice of the peace may continue
9 the case not exceeding twice or any other magistrate quali-

10 fied to take disclosures may attend and take the disclosure,
11 and, for cause shown by either party, the examination may
12 be adjourned from time to time.'
