STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT to amend section two of chapter two hundred ninety-seven of the Private and Special Laws of nineteen hundred seven, relating to the Fort Kent Village Corporation.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section two of chapter two hundred ninety-seven of the
2 private and special laws of nineteen hundred and seven is
3 hereby amended by adding in the second paragraph of said
4 section two, the words 'and to contract with the Fort Kent
5 Electric Company.' so that said section as amended shall
6 read as follows:

'Sect. 2. Said corporation is hereby authorized and vested
8 with power at any legal meeting called for the purpose, to

9 raise money to purchase, repair and maintain one or more
10 fire engines, fire hose and all other necessary apparatus, for
11 the extinguishment of fires, to build, repair and maintain
12 engine and hose houses, to construct reservoirs, to contract
13 with individuals or corporations for the supply of water
14 under pressure for the extinguishment of fire and maintain
15 within said limits an efficient fire department; to defray the
16 expenses of a night watch, a police force and all other nec-
17 essary measures for the better security of life and property,
18 and the promotion of good order and quiet within its limits.

Said corporation is also hereby authorized and vested with
20 power, at any legal meeting called for the purpose, to raise
21 money to generate, distribute and sell electricity and to con-
22 tract with the Fort Kent Electric Company, for heat and
23 lighting purposes within said limits, and to contract with
24 individuals or corporations for the supply of water under
25 pressure for household and family purposes, and the right
26 to do any or all of the above things wholly by said corpo-
27 ration, such as building, repairing, maintaining and supply-
28 ing water for fire protection and family use.'
