STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT to amend Section One of Chapter 48 of the Revised Statutes of Maine relative to banks and banking.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section one of Chapter 48 of the Revised Statutes of

- 2 1903, as amended by Chapter 12 of the Public Laws
- 3 of 1909 is hereby amended by striking out the word "one"
- 4 in the fifteenth line of said section and substituting therefor
- 5 the word 'two' and by striking out in the sixteenth line of
- 6 said section the word "commissioner" and inserting therefor
- 7 the word 'commissioners,' so that said section as amended
- 8 shall read as follows:

'Section 1. The governor, with the advice and consent of 10 the council, shall appoint a bank commissioner, who shall

11 hold his office for three years, subject to removal at any 12 time by the appointing power, and shall not during his con-13 tinuance in office hold any office in any bank in the State. 14 Wherever the words "bank examiner" now appear in the 15 statutes of the state, they shall be construed to mean bank 16 commissioner. The bank commissioner shall be paid the 17 salary now or hereafter provided by law for that office and 18 his necessary traveling expenses and the reasonable and 19 necessary expenses of his office, the payment of which shall 20 be made subject to the approval of the governor and coun-21 cil, and shall be authorized to employ at the expense of the 22 state, one or more clerks as the business of the office may 23 require, the amount of their compensation to be subject to 24 the approval of the governor and council, and two of whom 25 may be designated as deputy bank commissioners. 26 present bank examiner may serve out the unxpired term of 27 his office as bank commissioner without new appointment.'
