### STATE OF MAINE

## IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT to Amend the City Charter of South Portland thereby providing for the election of assessors by the citizens.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section five of the city charter of South Portland shall

be amended by inserting after the word "mayor" the
words 'and assessors'; by inserting after the word "wards"

the following: "The first election for assessors under this

act shall be at the first regular municipal election after it

shall have been adopted, at which time three assessors shall

be elected, one of whom shall be elected for one year, one

for two years, and one for three years, and at each subse-

9 quent election one assessor shall be elected for three years, 10 each of whom shall continue in office until some other per-11 son shall have been elected and qualified in his place; so 12 that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 5. The mayor and assessors shall be elected from 14 the citizens at large, by the legal voters of the city voting 15 in their respective wards. The first election for assessors 16 under this act shall be at the first regular municipal election 17 after it shall have been adopted, at which time three assess-18 ors shall be elected, one of whom shall be elected for one 19 year, one for two years, and one for three years, and at each 20 subsequent election one assessor shall be elected for three 21 years, each of whom shall continue in office until some other 22 person shall have been elected and qualified in his place. 23 One alderman, a member of the school committee, a war-24 den, a ward clerk and one constable, shall be elected by each 25 ward, being residents in the ward where elected. All of said 26 officers shall be elected by ballot as hereinafter provided.

Section nine of the city charter of South Portland shall 28 be amended by striking out the word "assessors," being 29 the second word in said section; also by striking out the 30 following words: "At the first election thereof under this 31 act, three persons shall be elected assessors, one of whom 32 shall be elected for one year, one for two years and one for 33 three years, and at each subsequent election one assessor 34 shall be elected for three years, each of whom shall con-35 tinue in office until some person shall have been elected and

qualified in his place. Three overseers of the poor shall be gelected in the same manner as are the assessors, and shall all hold office the same time, and all subsequent elections of these officers shall be in the same manner as all subsequent 40 elections for assessors;" by inserting after the word "be," the being the twenty-ninth word in said section, the following. There shall be three overseers of the poor to hold as office for the period of three years to be elected as their terms expire, each of whom shall continue until some other person shall have been elected and qualified in his place," to that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 9. The overseers of the poor and health officers 48 shall be elected by the city council on the second Monday in 40 March, or as soon thereafter as may be. There shall be 50 three overseers of the poor to hold office for the period of 51 three years to be elected as their terms expire, each of whom 52 shall continue until some other person shall have been elect-53 ed and qualified in his place. The city council may elect au 54 assistant assessor in each ward, whose duty it shall be to 55 furnish the assessors with all necessary information rela-56 tive to persons and property taxable in his ward. He shall 57 be sworn or affirmed, to the faithful performance of his 58 duty. All taxes shall be assessed, apportioned and col-50 lected in the manner prescribed by the laws of this state 60 relative to town taxes, except as herein modified, and the 61 city council may establish further or additional provisions 62 for the collection thereof, and of interest thereon. The

63 city council shall also elect a city solicitor and determine 64 his salary.'

Section sixteen of the city charter of South Portland shall 66 be amended by inserting after the word "mayor" being 67 the seventy-third word of said section, the following: 'Three 68 assessors at the first regular municipal election after this 69 act shall have been adopted, and one at each election there-70 after except in case of vacancies, when there shall be suffi-71 cient to fill said vacancies;' also after the word "mayor" be-72 ing the two hundred and eighty-fourth word in said section, 73 by inserting the following: 'and assessors'; so that said 74 section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 16. For the purpose of organizing the system of 76 government hereby established, and putting the same in 77 operation in the first instance, the selectmen of the town 78 shall at least seven days before the first Monday of March 79 after the acceptance of this charter, issue their warrant 80 for calling a meeting of the legal voters at such place and 81 hour of the day as they shall choose, for the purpose of 82 choosing a mayor, three assessors at the first regular mu-83 nicipal election after this act shall have been adopted, and 84 one at each election thereafter except in case of vacancies, 85 when there shall be sufficient to fill said vacancies, seven 86 aldermen, a school committee of seven, and seven constables 87 to be taken from the city at large; said officers shall be 88 elected by a plurality vote. The town clerk shall notify 89 the several officers-elect of their election, in writing, within

go twenty-four hours. Their powers and duties shall be as After the city has been divided into 91 herein provided. 92 wards, ward meetings of the legal voters thereof shall be 03 called, which meetings shall be presided over by some per-94 son appointed by the city council, and the records of said 95 first meetings in the several wards shall be made by some of person designated by the city council, and at said first meet-97 ings lists of voters, corrected by the aldermen, shall be deo8 livered to the persons designated to act as recording officers (a) in the several wards to be used as provided by law, in town 100 meetings. Said recording officers shall perform the du-101 ties of ward clerks, as before herein provided, relative to 102 making a record of the election and returning a copy of the 103 records of the city council. On the first Monday in March, 104 annually thereafter the qualified voters of each ward shall 105 vote on one ballot for city and ward officers, as hereafter 106 provided for all of which officers except the mayor and 107 assessors shall be residents of the ward or district where 108 elected. And all officers shall be elected by ballot, by a 100 plurality of the votes given, and shall hold their offices one 110 year from the second Monday in March, except members 111 of the school committee who shall be chosen for three years 112 after the first election under this charter, and until others 113 shall be elected and qualified in their places; all city and 114 ward officers shall be held to discharge the duties of the 115 offices to which they have been respectively elected, not-116 withstanding the removal after their election, out of their 117 respective wards, into any other ward in the city; the ward 118 clerk within twenty-four hours after such election shall 110 deliver to the ward officers elected, certificates of their 120 election, and shall forthwith deliver to the clerk a certified 121 copy of the record of such election, a plain and intelligible 122 abstract of which shall be entered by the city clerk upon 123 the city records. If the person elected shall refuse to ac-124 cept the offices, the said board shall issue their warrants 125 for another election; and in case of a vacancy in the office 126 of mayor by death, resignation or otherwise, it shall be 127 filled for the remainder of the term by a new election, to 128 be called as herein provided, and held within twenty days 120 after the vacancy occurs. The oath or affirmation pre-130 scribed by this act shall be administered to the mayor by 131 the city clerk, or any justice of the peace. The aldermen-132 elect shall meet on the second Monday of March at seven 133 o'clock in the evening, when the oath or affirmation, re-134 quired by the second section of this act shall be adminis-135 tered to the members present by the mayor, or any justice 136 of the peace. The city council shall by ordinance, deter-137 mine the times of holding stated or regular meetings of the 138 board, and shall also in like manner determine the man-130 ner of calling special meetings and the persons by whom 140 the same shall be called, but until otherwise provided by 141 ordinance, special meetings shall be called by the mayor 142 by causing a notification to be given in hand or left at the 143 usual residence of each member.'

Section twenty-one of the city charter of South Portland 145 shall be amended by inserting after the word "officers," 146 being the thirty-third word in said section, the following: 147 'except assessors;' so that said section as amended shall 148 read as follows:

'Sect. 21. All officers of the police department shall be 150 appointed by nomination by the mayor and confirmed by 151 the city council, and may be removed by them for good 152 cause. All other subordinate officers except assessors shall 153 be elected by the city council, and may be removed by 154 them for cause. Except as otherwise especially provided 155 in this act, all subordinate officers shall be elected annu-156 ally on the second Monday of March, or as soon thereafter 157 as may be, and their term of office shall be for one year, 158 and until others are qualified in their place.

The term of office of any assessor of the city of South 160 Portland shall expire immediately on the election and 161 qualification of assessors under the city charter of South 162 Portland as amended by this act.

This act shall take effect when approved by a majority 164 vote of the legal voters of South Portland, and shall be 165 submitted to the legal voters at the next annual election 166 to be held on the first Monday of March, 1916, and if it 167 fails of passage at that election, may be submitted to the 168 people at any future election by a majority vote of the 169 municipal officers. The city clerk shall reduce the subject 170 matter of this act to the following question: "Shall the

171 act providing for the election of assessors by the people 172 be accepted?" and the voters shall indicate by a cross placed 173 over the words "yes" or "no" their opinion of the same. 174 The result shall be declared by the municipal officers and 175 due certificate thereof filed by the city clerk with the sec-176 retary of state.'
