STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT relating to administering oaths required by law.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Chapter one hundred and thirty-three, section two of the 2 revised statutes, is hereby amended by inserting after the 3 word "courts" in the first line of said section the words 4 'clerk of courts', so that said section as amended shall read 5 as follows:

'Sect. 2. Judges of municipal and police courts, clerks of 7 courts, trial justices and justices of the peace; also women, 8 otherwise eligible under the constitution appointed by the 9 governor with the advice and consent of the council; may 10 administer all oaths required by law, unless another officer 11 is specially required to do it. Upon view of an affray, 12 riot, assault, or assault and battery, within their county, 13 such judges and justices may, without warrant, command the 14 assistance of any sheriff, deputy sheriff, constable or other 15 person present, to repress the same, and to arrest all con-16 cerned therein.'
