STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT to Amend Section Seven of Chapter Sixty-six of the Revised Statutes Relating to Proofs of Wills.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section seven of chapter sixty-six of the revised Statutes 2 is hereby amended by inserting after the word "facts" in 3 the fifth line of said section the following words: 'and the 4 affidavit of such witness or witnesses taken before a register 5 of probate may be received as evidence,' so that said section 6 as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 7. When it clearly appears to the judge by the 8 written consent of the heirs at law or otherwise, that there 9 is no objection thereto, he may decree the probate of any

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10 will upon the testimony of one or more of the three sub-11 scribing witnesses required by law, who can substantiate all 12 the requisite facts, and the affidavit of such witness or wit-13 nesses taken before the register of probate may be received 14 as evidence; or, in the cases described in the preceding sec-15 tion, upon the depositions of one or more of the subscribing 16 witnesses, substantiating the facts.'
