STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT additional to chapter thirty-two of the Revised Statutes, as amended by chapter two hundred and six of the Public Laws of nineteen hundred and thirteen, relating to fishing in Great brook and in Dixon brook, in York County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

No person shall fish for, take, catch or kill any kind of fish 2 at any time in Great brook, a tributary to Salmon Falls river, 3 or in Dixon brook, a tributary to said Great brook, in the 4 county of York; nor shall any person have in possession at 5 any time any kind of fish taken in either of said brooks.

Whoever violates any provision of this act shall pay a fine 7 of not less than ten dollars nor more than thirty dollars and

8 costs of prosecution for each offense; and in addition thereto 9 one dollar for each fish taken, caught, killed or had in pos-10 session in violation of any provision of this act.
