STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT to amend section thirty-six of chapter one hundred and one of the Revised Statutes, as amended by chapter fortyone of the Laws of nineteen hundred and seven, in relation to Bail Commissioners.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Chapter forty-one of the laws of nineteen hundred and 2 seven is hereby amended by striking out the last sentence 3 in said chapter so that said chapter, as amended, shall read 4 as follows:

'Sect. 36. Any person under arrest on criminal process for 6 a bailable offense, may, before commitment to jail, if he so

7 requests, be taken by the officer having him in charge, before 8 such commissioner, who may inquire into the case, and ad9 mit him to bail. And any person arrested on the Lord's 10 day, or on the afternoon or evening preceding, for a bailable 11 offense, may be admitted to bail on that day by such com12 missioner.'
