SENATE AMENDMENT A.

---

Amend House Bill No. 513 by striking out every-  
2 thing in the Act after the word "straw" in the 11th line of  
3 Section one, and inserting the following: 'or other general  
4 heavy freight.'

'Sect. 2. Any person, while driving or in charge of or oc-  
6 cupying a vehicle during the period from one hour after  
7 sunset to one hour before sunrise, shall give his correct  
8 name and address to any officer who has charge of the ex-  
9 ecution of the laws, when requested to do so.

'Sect. 3. Nothing contained in this Act shall be construed  
11 to effect the provisions of any statute, rule or regulation re-  
12 garding lighted lamps on motor vehicles and the obliga-

13 tions of operators or occupants thereof. The driver or cus-  
14 todian of a vehicle shall be deemed to be the responsible  
15 party.' So that this Act as amended shall read as follows:

'Section 1. Every vehicle on wheels, whether stationary  
17 or in motion, on any public highway or bridge, shall have  
18 attached to it a light or lights which shall be so displayed  
19 as to be visible from the front and the rear during the  
20 period from one hour after sunset to one hour before sun-  
21 rise: Provided, however, that this Act shall not apply to  
22 any vehicle which is designed to be propelled by hand, or to  
23 any vehicle while upon any lighted street or highway where  
24 street lights are maintained at a distance of five hundred  
25 feet apart or less, or to any vehicle designed for the trans-  
26 portation, as its principal freight, of hay or straw, or other  
27 general heavy freight.

Sect. 2. Any person, while driving or in charge of or oc-  
2 cupying a vehicle during the period from one hour after  
3 sunset to one hour before sunrise, shall give his correct  
4 name and address to any officer who has charge of the ex-  
5 ecution of the laws, when requested to do so.

Sect. 3. Nothing contained in this Act shall be construed  
2 to affect the provisions of any statute, rule or regulation re-  
3 garding lighted lamps on motor vehicles and the obligations  
4 of operators or occupants thereof. The driver or custodian  
5 of a vehicle shall be deemed to be the responsible party.
