STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section I of Chapter 85 of the Revised Statutes of Maine, 2 is hereby amended by inserting in the second line of said 3 section, after the word "council" the following words to 4 wit: 'provided that the County Commissioners for the County in which the candidate resides shall, in writing, at a 6 meeting of said Commissioners, first approve said candidate.' So that said section one as amended shall read as fol-

'Section 1. Trial justices shall be appointed and commis-10 sioned by the Governor, with the advice and consent of the 11 Council, provided that the County Commissioners for the 12 County in which the candidate resides shall, in writing, at a

13 meeting of said Commissioners, first approve said candidate,

14 to act within the county for which they are appointed, and

15 shall hold their offices for seven years from the date of

16 their commission.'
