STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE, appropriating money to assist the Town of Whitefield in building a bridge across the Sheepscot River at North Whitefield.

Resolved, That there be and hereby is appropriated the

- 2 sum of one thousand dollars (\$1000) to aid in building an
- 3 iron bridge across the Sheepscot river in the town of White-
- 4 field provided the said town of Whitefield appropriate a
- 5 like sum of one thousand dollars (\$1000) for the same pur-
- 6 pose, both sums to be expended under the supervision of
- 7 the highway department and be available in the year one
- 8 thousand nine hundred and sixteen.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The Sheepscot river runs the entire length of the town of Whitefield north and south. The town had built and maintained six bridges for a hundred years, which has accommodated the travel of all towns east of that town in Lincoln county and several towns in Knox county, including the city of Rockland. The time has now come when they must rebuild at least two of these bridges, and they believe it no more than fair that the state should assist in building an iron bridge across this river at North Whitefield.
