STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT to amend section six of chapter one hundred eighty-eight of the public laws of nineteen hundred eleven relating to industrial courses in evening schools.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section six of chapter one hundred eighty-eight of the
2 public laws of nineteen hundred eleven is hereby amended
3 by striking out all of said section after the word "in" in the
4 seventh line thereof and substituting in place thereof the
5 following: 'the commercial branches, the domestic and man-
6 ual arts or the elements of the trades, said courses to be
7 subject to the approval of the state superintendent of pub-
8 lic schools and no town shall be entitled to receive a reim-

9 bursement under the provisions of this section unless the
10 total average attendance in said courses shall equal to not
11 less than twenty-five per cent of the average attendance of
12 the school,' so that said section when amended shall read as
13 follows :

'Sect. 6. Whenever the superintending school committee
15 of any town shall have maintained during the school year
16 an evening school as provided by section twenty-two of the
17 revised statutes, said town shall be reimbursed by the state
18 a sum equal to two-thirds the amount paid for instruction
19 in such evening school provided there shall have been offered,
20 in addition to the subjects elsewhere prescribed for evening
21 schools, courses in the commercial branches, the domestic
22 and manual arts or the elements of the trades, said courses
23 to be subject to the approval of the state superintendent of
24 public schools, and no town shall be entitled to receive a
25 reimbursement under the provisions of this section unless
26 the total average attendance in said courses shall equal to
27 not less than twenty-five per cent of the average attendance
28 of the school.'
