STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE, in favor of Thomas Clark.

*Resolved, That the retirement pay of Thomas Clark shall
2 be five hundred dollars per year instead of the amount now
3 provided by law.*

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Captain Thomas Clark, who had served four years and five months in the Eleventh Maine Infantry during the Civil War, commenced work as clerk in the office of the adjutant general of Maine June 2, 1886, at a salary of one thousand dollars per year, which rate he received until July 31, 1911. At this time his rate of salary was reduced to seven hundred dollars per year, which rate he received until his retirement, December 31, 1914. As the law under which he was retired based his retirement pay on the compensation he was receiving at the time of retirement, thus giving him three hundred and fifty dollars per year, he respectfully asks that the same may be increased to five hundred dollars per year on the basis of his former salary.
