STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE, Regarding Book of Plans for Knox County.

Resolved, That the State Land Agent be and hereby is instructed to cause the book of plans for Knox County to be completed by adding to the plans already in said book a plan of Isle au Haut and copies of such plans in the Massachusetts archives as have not already been copied (especially plans No. 1550 and No. 1551) and by having all copies certified by the Secretary of State for Massachusetts, after which said book shall be forwarded to the Register of Deeds for said county of Knox and the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars—or such part of that sum as may be necessary—is hereby appropriated to pay the expense of such completion.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

(Some 25 years ago or more a start was made at copying all plans of Maine lands in the Massachusetts archives and most of the work was done—the plan being to have two copies made of each plan—one for the land office and one for the Registry of Deeds in the county where the land is situated—the work was mostly done and most of the counties, especially the large counties, received their copies years ago. The book for Knox county is as far as known complete with the exception of the two plans in Massachusetts named above and the plan of Isle au Haut. There were two original plans of Isle au Haut, one of which is in the book furnished Hancock county and the other in the Land Office—this referring to the “Lathrop Lewis” plan, there being other, later plans, by other parties. None of the plans have been certified by the Sec’y. of State of Mass.)
