STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE, in favor of construction of Lord Bridge over

Marsh stream in the town of Frankfort.

Resolved, That there be and hereby is appropriated the

- 2 sum of four thousand dollars (\$4000) to be used in the
- 3 construction of the so-called "Lord bridge," and approaches
- 4 to same, across Marsh stream in the town of Frankfort,
- 5 on the road leading from Frankfort to Monroe; said ex-
- 6 penditure to be made under the supervision of the state
- 7 highway commission.



STATEMENT OF FACTS.

There are four bridges over the Marsh stream in the town of Frankfort; three of these bridges have been rebuilt within the last twelve years at a cost to the town of thirteen thousand dollars. The Lord bridge, so called, is now in such a condition that it should be repaired or rebuilt at once, and the town having reached its debt limit feels obliged to ask the state for assistance. The valuation of the town for 1915 was \$300,000, the tax rate for 1914 was \$0.028.
