STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT to permit the citizens of Maine to express their desires regarding constitutional provisions.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Whenever a petition signed by twelve thousand (12,000) legal voters of Maine shall be presented to the Secretary of State asking that at the next regular state election the voters of Maine be given an opportunity to express themselves upon any desired change in the constitution of the State of Maine, the ballots to be used at the State election next following the presentation of such petition shall have upon them the proposition for which said petition is presented, in such form as to enable the voters to express themselves for or against such proposed constitutional alteration.
