STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT to equalize the salaries of county commissioners.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- Section 1. Each county commissioner in the several counties shall receive an annual salary from the county treasury in quarterly payments on the first days of January, April, July and October, as follows:
- 1 Androscoggin, seven hundred fifty dollars.
 - 2 Aroostook, eleven hundred dollars.
 - 3 Cumberland, thirteen hundred fifty dollars.
 - 4 Franklin, four hundred fifty dollars.
 - 5 Hancock, six hundred dollars.
 - 6 Kennebec, nine hundred dollars.
 - 7 Knox, four hundred dollars.

- 12 Lincoln, three hundred dollars.
- 13 Oxford, six hundred dollars.
- 14 Penobscot, twelve hundred dollars.
- 15 Piscataquis, five hundred dollars.
- 16 Sagadahoc, four hundred dollars.
- 17 Somerset, six hundred fifty dollars.
- 18 Waldo, four hundred dollars.
- 19 Washington, six hundred fifty dollars.
- 20 York, eight hundred fifty dollars.

Said salaries shall be in full for all services, expenses and
22 travel, including the management of the jails and work
23 shops and the sale of their products, except actual necessary
24 cash expenses incurred outside of their respective coun-
25 ties for the transaction of official business; all bills for such
26 expenses shall be approved by the clerk of courts and the
27 county attorney of their county; excepting also, such ex-
28 pense as are provided for in section one and two, chapter
29 194 of the Public Laws 1913.

Sect. 2. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent with the
2 provisions of this act are hereby repealed.

Sect. 3. Any official now receiving a salary greater than
2 is herein provided shall continue to receive his present sal-
3 ary until the expiration of his term of office.
