STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT to equalize the salaries of the Registers of Probate.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- Section 1. Registers of probate in the several counties
- 2 shall receive annual salaries from the treasuries of the coun-
- 3 ties in quarterly payments on the first days of January,
- 4 April, July and October, as follows:
- 5 Androscoggin, twelve hundred dollars.
- 6 Aroostook, thirteen hundred dollars.
- 7 Cumberland, seventeen hundred dollars.
- 8 Franklin, eight hundred dollars.
- 9 Hancock, one thousand dollars.
- 10 Kennebec, twelve hundred dollars.
- 11 Knox, one thousand dollars.

- 12 Lincoln, eight hundred dollars.
- 13 Oxford, one thousand dollars.
- 14 Penobscot, fifteen hundred dollars.
- 15 Piscataquis, eight hundred dollars.
- 16 Sagadahoc, eight hundred dollars.
- 17 Somerset, one thousand dollars.
- 18 Waldo, nine hundred dollars.
- 19 Washington, one thousand dollars.
- 20 York, fourteen hundred dollars.

The sums above mentioned shall be in full compensation
22 for the performance of all duties required of registers of
23 probate.

Sect. 2. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent with the
2 provisions of this act are hereby repealed.

Sect. 3. Any official now receiving a salary greater than
2 is herein provided shall continue to receive his present sal-
3 ary until the expiration of his term of office.
