STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT to equalize the salaries of the clerks of the Judicial Courts.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. The clerks of the Judicial Courts in the several 2 counties shall receive annual salaries from the treasuries 3 of the counties in quarterly payments on the first days of 4 January, April, July and October, as follows:

5 Androscoggin, two thousand dollars.

6 Aroostook, two thousand dollars.

7 Cumberland, twenty-five hundred dollars.

8 Franklin, twelve hundred dollars.

9 Hancock, sixteen hundred dollars.

10 Kennebec, twenty-three hundred fifty dollars.

11 Knox, thirteen hundred dollars.

12 Lincoln, one thousand dollars.

13 Oxford, sixteen hundred dollars.

14 Penobscot, twenty-two hundred dollars.

15 Piscataquis, twelve hundred dollars.

16 Sagadahoc, fifteen hundred dollars.

17 Somerset, eighteen hundred dollars.

18 Waldo, twelve hundred dollars.

19 Washington, fourteen hundred fifty dollars.

20 York, nineteen hundred dollars.

21 Cumberland Deputy Clerk, eighteen hundred dollars.

The sums above mentioned shall be in full compensation 23 for the performance of all duties required of clerks, includ-24 ing those performed by them as clerks of the supreme ju-25 dicial court, superior and county commissioners courts or 26 by clerks pro tempore, employed by them.

Sect. 2. All acts or parts of acts inconsistent with the 2 provisions of this act are hereby repealed.

Sect. 3. Any official now receiving a salary greater 2 than is herein provided shall continue to receive his pres-3 ent salary until the expiration of his term of office.
