STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT to define county lines in the waters of the State.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
Section I. The lines of the several counties of the state
which terminate at or in tide waters, are extended in the
shortest and most direct line from the place where they
terminate to the extreme limit of the waters under the jurisdiction of this state, and all waters between such lines off
the shores of the respective counties shall be a part of, and
held to be within such counties, respectively.

Sect. 2. Any official authorized to issue warrants within 2 any county, may issue warrants for offenses committed in 3 or upon the waters so made a part of such county, or the 4 waters of any adjoining county; and said warrants shall 5 be returnable in the county where issued, and the courts in 6 such county shall have jurisdiction of the offense. Officers 7 have the same authority upon all such waters as they have 8 upon land within the county where the warrant is issued.
