STATE OF MAINE

AN ACT to amend section seventy-one of chapter four of the Revised Statutes relating to the authority of towns to raise money.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section seventy-one of chapter four of the revised statutes 2 is hereby amended by inserting after the word "bridges" in 3 the third line, the following words: 'and sprinkling streets; 4 acquiring by purchase or otherwise suitable sites, or suitable 5 sites and buildings, or erecting buildings for free public 6 libraries,' so that said section as amended shall read as fol- 7 lows:

'Sect. 71. The voters, at a legal town meeting, may raise 9 the necessary sums for the support of schools and the poor; 10 making and repairing highways, town ways and bridges, and 11 sprinkling streets; acquiring by purchase or otherwise suit- 12 able sites, or suitable sites and buildings, or erecting build-

13 ings, for free public libraries; purchasing and fencing bury-
14 ing-grounds; purchasing or building and repairing a hearse
15 and hearse-house, for the exclusive use of its citizens; and
16 for other necessary town charges.'
