## STATE OF MAINE

#### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT to amend section seven of chapter two hundred and twenty-one of the Public Laws of nineteen hundred and thirteen relating to the nomination of United States Senators.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section seven of chapter two hundred and twenty-one of 2 the public laws of nineteen hundred and thirteen is hereby 3 amended by striking out the first sentence of said section, 4 and inserting in place thereof the following sentence: 5 Whenever one or more United States senators are to be 6 elected at the biennial state election held on the second Mon-7 day of September, the nominee or nominees for such of-8 fice or offices, of each political party, shall be chosen at 9 the primary election held on the third Monday in June pre-

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10 ceding,' so that said section as amended shall read as follows :

'Sect. 7. Whenever one or more United States senators 12 are to be elected at the biennial state election held on the 13 scond Monday of September, the nominee or nominees for 14 such office or offices, of each political party, shall be chosen 15 at the primary election held on the third Monday in June 16 preceding. Nominations therefor shall be made and filed 17 as hereinbefore provided. But where one United States 18 senator is to be so elected, the nomination papers and offi-19 cial ballot shall specify simply the office of United States 20 senator. When, however, two United States senators are 21 so to be elected, the nomination papers and ballots shall by 22 apt words designate the respective terms for which they are 23 to be nominated.'
