AN ACT to amend section one of chapter one hundred and forty-five of the Public Laws of the year nineteen hundred and eleven entitled "An Act to insure publicity with respect to the demands upon the State and to facilitate the Legislative Committees in dealing with questions of Appropriation."

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

Section one of chapter one hundred and forty-five of the  
2 public laws of the year nineteen hundred and eleven is  
3 hereby amended to read as follows:

'Section 1. On or before the first Monday of December  
5 in each year preceding the session of the legislature, every

6 corporation, not including municipal corporations, and every  
7 association and institution, whether public or private, re-  
8 ceiving an appropriation from the state, shall file with the  
9 state auditor a statement in detail of all moneys, with the  
10 reason therefor, for which any general or special appro-  
11 priation is desired at the ensuing session of the legislature,  
12 by such corporation, association or institution. The state  
13 auditor may from time to time, require any such corpo-  
14 ration, association or institution to report to him as to such  
15 fiscal affairs as he may deem necessary for the proper com-  
16 pilation of the tabulation provided in the following section.  
17 Each of the reports and statements of desired appropria-  
18 tion which is made shall be in such form as may be pre-  
19 scribed by the state auditor, and shall be public records.'
