AN ACT additional to chapter thirty-two of the revised statutes, as amended by chapter two hundred and six of the public laws of nineteen hundred and thirteen, relating to the protection of fish, game and birds on the southerly point of Swan Island, in the town of Perkins, in the county of Sagadahoc.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

For a period of five years from the time this act takes  
2 effect, no person shall fish for, take, catch or kill, at any  
3 time, any kind of fish, or hunt, chase, catch, kill or destroy,  
4 at any time, any wild bird or any wild animal, within the  
5 following described territory, situated on the southerly

6 point of Swan Island, in the town of Perkins, in the county  
7 of Sagadahoc:

All the territory situated southerly of the land formerly  
9 owned by Robert Reed to high water mark on the shores  
10 thereof.

No person shall have in possession, at any time, any kind  
12 of fish or any wild bird or wild animal taken in violation of  
13 any provision of this act.

Whoever violates any provision of this act shall pay a fine  
15 of ten dollars and costs for each offense, and in addition  
16 thereto one dollar for each fish or wild animal or wild bird  
17 taken, caught, killed or had in possession in violation of any  
18 provision of this act.
