STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT to amend section one of chapter two of the Public Laws of one thousand nine hundred and eleven, declaring a close time on scallops.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section one of chapter two of the public laws of one thou-2 sand nine hundred and eleven is hereby amended by adding 3 at the end of said section the following:

'But this act shall not apply to any of the waters of Penob-

- 5 scot bay, lying between lines running south from Naskeag
- 6 Point on the east, and from Dice's Head, by the eastern
- 7 shore of Islesboro, on the west, and including the waters
- 8 of Bagaduce River; where scallops may be taken between

9 June 15 and September 15 of each year. It shall be un-10 lawful to ship scallops so taken out of the state and the 11 same penalties for such unlawful shipment shall apply as 12 are prescribed in the first paragraph of the succeeding sec-13 tion of this act.'
