STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT to amend section six of chapter one hundred eightyeight of the Public Laws of nineteen hundred eleven relating to industrial courses in Evening Schools.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section six of chapter one hundred eighty-eight of the

- 2 public laws of nineteen hundred eleven is hereby amended
- 3 by striking out all of said section after the word "in" in the
- 4 seventh line thereof and substituting in place thereof the
- 5 following: 'the commercial branches, the domestic and man-
- 6 ual arts or the elements of the trades, said courses to be
- 7 ject to the approval of the state superintendent of public
- 8 schools and no town shall be entitled to receive a reimburse-

9 ment under the provisions of this section unless the total 10 average attendance in said courses shall equal to not less 11 than twenty-five per cent of the average attendance of the 12 school,' so that said section when amended shall read as 13 follows:

'Sect. 6. Whenever the superintending school committee of any town shall have maintained during the school year an evening school as provided by section twenty-two of the revised statutes said town shall be reimbursed by the state as sum equal to two-thirds the amount paid for instruction in such evening school provided there shall have been of-confered, in addition to the subjects elsewhere prescribed for evening schools, courses in the commercial branches, the domestic and manual arts or the elements of the trades, said courses to be subject to the approval of the state superintendent of public schools and no town shall be entitled to receive a reimbursement under the provisions of this section unless the total average attendance in said courses shall equal to not less than twenty-five per cent of the average attendance of the school.'
