STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT to amend section three of chapter fifty-eight of the Public Laws of nineteen hundred thirteen relating to the State Certification of Teachers of Public Schools.

Bc it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 3 of chapter 58 of the public laws of nineteen hun-2 dred thirteen is hereby amended by striking out the words 3 "unless he is seventeen years of age and has completed a 4 standard high school or academy course shall be eligible 5 for a certificate," in the sixth, seventh and eighth lines there-6 of and by substituting in place thereof the following: 'shall 7 be eligible for a certificate unless he is at least seventeen 8 years of age and has completed not less than a standard 9 secondary school course or unless he shall present satisfac-10 tory evidence of such educational attainment otherwise se-11 cured as may be adjudged by the state superintendent of 12 public schools to be the equivalent of said standard second-13 ary school course,' so that said section when amended shall 14 read as follows:

'Sect. 3. Certificates of qualification signed by the state 16 superintendent of public schools shall be granted to all can-17 didates who pass satisfactory examinations in such branches 18 as are required or permitted by law to be taught in the 19 public schools and who in other respects fulfill the proper 20 requirements, provided, however, that no person shall be 21 eligible for a certificate unless he is at least seventeen years 22 of age and has completed not less than a standard second-23 ary school course or unless he shall present satisfactory 24 evidence of such educational attainment otherwise secured 25 as may be adjudged by the state superintendent of public 26 schools to be the equivalent of said standard secondary 27 school course. Such certificate shall be either probationary 28 or permanent and shall indicate the grade of schools which 29 the person named therein is qualified to teach. Provided, 30 however, that the certificate may be granted without the 31 examination herein prescribed to graduates of colleges and 32 Maine state normal schools, or of other normal training 33 schools having a two years' course for graduates of high 34 schools or academies, and to teachers of two years' service 35 and satisfactory fitness, on the presentation of such evidence 36 of fitness and under such special conditions as the state su-37 perintendent of public schools may prescribe. Provided, 38 further, that certificates may, under the rules prescribed by 39 the state superintendent, be granted to persons holding state 40 certificates granted by authority of other states. Pro-41 vided, further, that any certificate granted under this or any 42 preceding act may for sufficient cause be revoked and an-43 nulled.'
