STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT authorizing the Insurance Commissoiner to review rates fixed by Fire Insurance Companies or the representatives of Fire Insurance Companies.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. No fire insurance company or other insurer

- 2 against a risk of fire or lightning, or any rating bureau,
- 3 board or committee shall fix or charge any rate for fire
- 4 insurance upon property in this state which discriminates
- 5 unfairly between risks of essentially the same hazard or hav-
- 6 ing substantially the same degrees of protection against fires.

Sect. 2. The insurance commissioner shall have power, 2 on written complaint, to review any rate fixed by any fire 3 insurance company, rating bureau, board or committee upon 4 property within this state for the purpose of determining 5 whether the same is discriminatory or unjust. He shall 6 have power to order the discrimination removed or to fix 7 an order substituting a rate which is not discriminatory or 8 unjust. A review of such rate before the insurance com-9 missioner shall be had only after seven days' notice for 10 hearing, and his findings or order shall in all cases be sub-11 ject to review of the courts of this state. In the event of 12 final determination against the insurer any over-charge dur-13 ing the pendency of such proceedings shall be refunded to 14 the persons entitled thereto.
