STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT to Amend Section Six of Chapter One Hundred and Twenty-two of the Revised Statutes Relating to the Penalty for Manufacturing or Having in Possession Implements and Materials for Counterfeiting.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section six of chapter one hundred and twenty-two of the
revised statutes is hereby amended by striking out the words
five hundred" in the seventh line thereof, and by inserting
hin place thereof the words 'one thousand,' so that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 6. Whoever makes or begins to make, mend, cast, 7 stamp, engrave, mould or provide any plate, block, press, 8 tool, instrument, paper or other material, designed and 9 adapted for making any false, forged or counterfeit coin, 10 public securities, bank bills or notes, mentioned in this chapter; or has the same in his possession partly or wholly made, 12 with intent to use or permit them to be used for that pur-13 pose, shall be punished by imprisonment for not more than 14 three years or by fine not exceeding one thousand dollars; 15 and all such tools, implements and materials shall be disposed 16 of as provided in section twelve of chapter one hundred and 17 twenty-six.'
