STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT to amend Section 4 of Chapter 61, R. S., as amended by Chapter 166 of the Public Laws of 1913, relating to Marriage and the Registration of Vital Statistics.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 4 of chapter 61, revised statutes, as amended by chapter 166 of the public laws of 1913, is further amended by adding to said section, the following:

‘Provided, that when it shall appear to the clerk of any town with whom notice of intentions of marriage shall be filed, that the woman has made her accusation, under oath, before a justice of the peace, as provided by section 1 of chapter 99, revised statutes, and that said justice has issued

9 his warrant of arrest as provided therein and the parties
10 have consented to be united in marriage, and no objection
11 has been made in writing by the overseers of the poor of
12 any town interested, as provided by section 8 of said chap-
13 ter, then and in such case, the clerk aforesaid, shall be au-
14 thorized to ante-date such notice of intentions of marriage
15 for a period of five days and the certificate shall issue forth-
16 with.'
