STATE OF MAINE

AN ACT relative to the Hours of Labor of Employees of Street

Railway Companies.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section I. A day's work for all conductors and motormen 2 who are employed by or on behalf of a street railway shall 3 not exceed nine hours, and shall be so arranged by the em4 ployer that it shall be performed within cleven consecutive 5 hours. No officer or agent of any such company shall re6 quire from said employees more than nine hours' work for 7 a day's labor. Threat of loss of employment or threat to 8 obstruct or prevent the obtaining of employment by the 9 employees, or threat to refrain from employing any em10 ployee in the future shall be considered coercion and re11 quiring, within the meaning of this section. But nothing

- 12 herein shall prevent an employee of the character mentioned 13 in this act, if he so desires, from working more hours than 14 those prescribed in the act for extra compensation.
 - Sect. 2. A company which violates any provision of this 2 act shall forfeit for each offense not less than one hundred 3 dollars nor more than five hundred dollars.
 - Sect. 3. This act shall not apply to electric roads operating 2 in Aroostook and Somerset counties.
